What is a word?

How many words does this sentence have :

Isn't the weather nice?

What is one syllable?

How many syllables are there in this word : *beautifully?*

What is a letter?

How many letters are there in this word (f.i. the child's own name)

Grammatical structures

How do you know that there are many of these ? (hold up ten fingers)

How do you know if it is male or female?

How do you know when something happens or is happning? (yesterday, today, tomorrow)

Is Christina a boy's name or a girl's name? How do you know that?

Show them a rhyme or a poem: Which words rhyme here?

What sounds good / nice oder not good / not nice ?

Plural, quantity

Article, pronoun, the meaning of the word verbforms, temporal adverbs

Semantics

What does X mean ? (f.i. apple)

Why is it called X?

Why do you call the little finger *pinky*?

Can you call 'a house' *a chair*? Can you call 'an apple' *a peanut*? Why / Why not?
